



Call for Abstracts

Topics

Abstract must fall primarily within the field of sports science, physical activity and / or human movement in connection with digital technologies. They may concern the fields of biomechanics, computer science, neurosciences and motor control, physiology, health, human and social sciences, intervention sciences, engineering sciences or any other field of research related to physical and sports activities.

Submission format

The abstract, submitted in *English*, must follow the instructions given on the congress website with respect to the submission interface (<https://acaps2021.sciencesconf.org/submission/submit>). The review and any corrections will be made via the submission interface. Abstract should be maximum **3,000 characters** (without spaces). Given the current context and the submission period, paper proposals may incorporate preliminary results or correspond to a study protocol.

Abstracts will be printed / published faithfully to the validated submitted version. It is therefore important to take the greatest care in the writing and the formal quality of the abstract. Non-compliant abstracts cannot be accepted. After reviewing, possible corrections and acceptance of the abstract proposal, the final version of the abstract must be resubmitted on the online interface. It will be the subject of a publication in the multidisciplinary open archive HAL.

The first author is assumed to be the author presenting his research and must register for the congress no later than **September 6, 2021** (however, it is recommended to register before July 30, 2021 to benefit from the discounted fees). **One author can only be first author on one abstract.**

Presentations format

Three presentation formats are proposed:

- Oral in a thematic symposium (ex: 4 presentations of 20 min, 10 min of general discussion for a total duration of 1 h 30 min)
- Free oral (total time: 15 min - 12 min presentation and 3 min discussion)
- Poster (1 hour poster sessions with 3 min presentation)

NB: Due to the necessarily limited number of symposia, the Scientific Committee may have to ask certain authors to present their proposal(s) to free oral communication. Likewise, certain requests for free oral communications may be considered in poster. These decisions will in no way correspond to a devaluation of the proposed work: the level of scientific requirement will be the same for all communications, whether oral or poster. They will aim to preserve a diversity of oral presentations, and to seek a balance between the different disciplinary fields while giving priority to interdisciplinary work on the theme of the congress. The scientific programme committee will also be called upon to organize, synthesize and select symposia proposals related to the theme of the congress (1 single communication per member of the same research unit or institution; multidisciplinary views; at least 4 communications per symposia) in order to best balance the scientific program.

Information concerning oral and poster presentations

For oral and poster presentations, the written support must be in *English*.

• Poster

- Format: A0 (841 x 1189 mm)
- Page orientation: Portrait only
- Each poster must be legible from a distance of 1.50 to 2 m.
- Posters must be installed the night before or in the morning at the latest on the locations whose numbers appear in the program. Members of the organization will be available to inform and assist you. The posters will be displayed throughout the day (with a time dedicated to their presentation), and removed by the participants in the evening after the last communication.

• Free oral presentation or symposia

- During free oral sessions, authors will have a maximum of 12 minutes to present their work, followed by 3 minutes of questions and answers with the audience.
- In thematic symposia, time management will be left to the discretion of the symposium manager.
